THANK YOU MAIZIES BISTRO for the excellent hor d'eurves at the October meeting. Neighbors, if you haven't wandered into this charming little bistro at 4750 N. Central Ave. for refreshment, do. It's a great addition to our neighborhood!

LIGHT RAIL is up and running. ALLABOARD! Trains offer a new way to explore the valley! Park-and-rides have bike as well as auto parking! For information on light rail safety go to www.metrolightrail.org/safety. For schedules and route suggestions use WalleyMetro.org. Even more light rail info is at MetroLightRail.org, offering the merchant discount program, newsletters, and meeting notices! Go to http://www.mag.maricopa.gov/maps.cms for an updated BIKING TRAILS MAP with references especially for commuters showing connections with public transportation alternatives! Remember, they do expect us to pay to ride: a variety of passes are available, but need to be activated, which can be done at the station where you board.

VOLUNTEER CO-CHAIRS FOR THE TRAFFIC COMMITTEE. The city completed the first of two traffic studies in our neighborhood. Already our streets are sufficiently busy to warrant traffic mitigation. We look forward to exploring how to employ methods to best resolve the safety concerns neighbors express as our streets get busier. Bev Bodiroga {Mariposa} and Trish Zemsch {Mariposa} have offered to Co-chair the Traffic Committee and appreciate any assistance you offer, as well as issues brought to their attention. This is *not* to say they are going to single or double-handedly resolve all traffic related issues in the neighborhood overnight, but they can expedite the exchange of ideas and collect and disseminate information for alternatives to the challenges. Their goal is to maintain our neighborhood a safe place to walk, bike, rollerblade, skate, or drive! Thank you, ladies, for tackling this issue [Ed.]

CHANGES AT HIGHLAND AND 7TH AVE. A neighborhood petition drive closed off legal access to all Pierson Place streets from southbound 7th Ave. during rush hour several years ago. A recent petition drive opened one street during rush hour into the neighborhood from southbound 7th Ave. By Ballot and petitions enough signatures were collected to support removing the no-left-turn sign at Highland effective 1/2/09. This initiates more changes to traffic within our boundaries. While we can now legally enter our neighborhood from southbound 7th Avenue at Highland during the morning rush hour; so can many others!

OUR BLOCK WATCH grants fund improvements for our neighborhood. We must again be thinking of what is needed to increase safety and live-ability for folks in the neighborhood. A new dawn, a new day, a new year. Turning the page into 2009 brings opportunity for fresh commitments and new goals. It's time to review accomplishments and take a hard look at what should be tackled this year. We have faced our share of challenges, and this year is likely to bring new ones never imagined. All of these perspectives are good for a budding neighborhood, good for growth and renewal, and especially good for sustaining prominence.

One hot topic is likely to be traffic. New problems created by the opening of Light Rail will surely be on our plate. The good news is, the city is committed to helping resolve these problems. A traffic study was done last November, and another will be done after the rail has been running a few months. Then from a neighborhood-wide perspective, city engineers will design a combination of mitigation measures they believe will improve our traffic. A super majority of residents must approve most proposed changes, and we will be working together on these petitions this spring.

Our third message board will be installed at Mariposa and 3rd Avenue this month. Look for crime fighting information, current events, meeting announcements, and the newsletter posted there. Many thanks go to Beverley Bodiroga (Mariposa), Steve Bass (Elm) and Elaine McLean (Hazelwood) for keeping the boards current. And, be sure to look for new gates in the abandoned alleys on 3rd Avenue between Highland and Coolidge and Coolidge and Hazelwood in February. We added new streetlights in these areas last quarter, which illuminated (and eliminated) these two hot spots!


