


Historic Plaques Coming

Parks & Recreation Services Update

The Phoenix Parks and Recreation Department, and several of its partner organizations, are offering a variety of FREE virtual programs, activities and resources to help residents of all ages stay active during the COVID-19 pandemic.

City parks, trails and golf courses have remained open throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, but use of select park amenities and all sports complexes is being restricted.

Following a vote by the City Council during its December 2 meeting, all athletic field reservations and tournaments at facilities managed by the city's Parks and Recreation Department are canceled effective December 3. The City Council vote also included closure of ramadas, picnic tables, fitness equipment, basketball and volleyball courts, and sports complexes in Phoenix parks effective December 3. The closures and cancellations will be in place until the COVID-19 community spread metric returns to the moderate level in Maricopa County, as monitored by the Arizona Department of Health Services.

Groups of 10 or less are permitted in city parks as long as individuals are spaced six feet apart, spectators are wearing masks or properly physically distanced, and the group is not participating in full contact athletic games and activities. Residents can find detailed information about the city's outdoor recreational options at Phoenix.gov/Parks.

Address Numbers on Curbs & Alleys

Painting address numbers on our curbs and alley fences is a crime prevention project funded by our Block Watch grant this year. We plan to do the curb on every house in the neighborhood and roughly every other fence in the alleys. This project helps the police determine their location fast in emergency situations, which could be life-saving. We plan to get bids from private providers in the next few weeks, and also contact the owners of fences in alleys. We expect this will start soon and be done in March. Look for more info about this via email and Nextdoor in the next few weeks.

Summary:

This month the dynamics have changed considerably, there is more crime overall with a major increase along Central. The Sexual Assault at Central and Turney is included because it is such a grave crime and near a fairly active area.

Crime increased in Pierson Place by two with 3 Burglaries and 4 Thefts. This is a lot of crime by comparison to the past, so we need to double down by being more alert to potential crimes and increase our vigilance. Be sure to call the police if you see something suspicious. Example, if you see someone on a bicycle circling around on the street and looking onto properties call it in (I have many times). Try to remember what the person was wearing (height, gender, colors and styles of person or bicycle, type of bicycle and extraneous, like backpack, hat, saddlebags etc.). Many times subliminal feelings are correct. If the police do see them and stop to talk to them and no arrest is made it sends a message to the criminals that this neighborhood is tight against crime and we are vigilant. It is through vigilance that a neighborhood prevents crime. We are the eyes for the police. They are the action force against crime. Although at times you just being around and visible prevents crime. Criminals don't like witnesses.

Compared to the other troubled intersections on Camelback (15th and 19th Ave) 7th Ave and Camelback has about the same amount of crime. All of the intersections are less crime ridden this month. 19th Ave had 8 (2 assaults) and both 15th Ave and 7the Ave had 7 crimes each (2 assaults). But we can do better and have in the recent past. So let's work at it.

Overall 19th Ave has 9 crimes, 7th Ave 6 and 15th 4. It appears that the crime at 19th Ave and Camelback is closely centered in the intersection and 4 corners while 7th Ave and Camelback is somewhat more diffuse than just the intersection. Ofcourse I feel anxiety in either intersection, but more so at 19th and Camelback Ave when riding my bicycle especially.

Generally speaking crime is down in our portion of the city along Camelback and around our historic district, no doubt due in part to the extremely high heat this year and as well The Pandemic. It is interesting that crime is down generally when there have been many work restrictions this year and unemployed people. One would think it might be the reverse since many people are out of work.
